
As you can see, your PTSA membership dues is an investment in our students and school community. We hope you choose to join us again this year!





STUDENT SERVICES UPDATES

The 2023-2024 school year has started, and the Guidance Services team has a lot going on. Continue to check the PTSA Newsletter monthly and Canvas for important information and updates from our department.

Guidance Services Page of Canvas

The school counseling staff works hard to make sure that necessary and helpful information is available for students and families. Each tab on the <u>Canvas</u> Guidance Services page is filled with important information. We encourage students and families to regularly look at the guidance page for updates, deadlines, opportunities, and helpful information.

Volunteer/Paid Work Hours Update

The Florida Legislature made changes to the 2023-2024 Bright Futures requirements that all students & families should be aware of. Last school year the state required students to *choose* either paid work hours or volunteer hour. **This year, students can combine their volunteer hours and paid work hours.**

Students and families should be aware of each Bright Future scholarships' requirements. Information is posted on the <u>district website</u> and in the <u>Bright Futures Handbook</u>. Additional information is provided on the Guidance Services page of <u>Canvas</u>.

NEW! How to Record Volunteer & Paid Work Hours

With the legislative changes, Profferfish will no longer be used to record volunteer hours electronically. Two **NEW** paper forms have been created. One form is used to record volunteer hours, the other is to record paid work hours. Both forms are available on the <u>district website</u>, the Guidance Services page of <u>Canvas</u>, and printed in the Guidance Office. Old forms used in previous years will not be accepted.

Students must fill out the appropriate form for the hours earned, get the required signatures, and complete the reflection.

- The volunteer form requires the signature of a person who oversaw the project. This cannot be a parent.
- If your student is combining paid work and volunteer hours, they will use both forms to record their hours.

Submit completed forms to the guidance office using the provided bin.

Bright Futures Updates

Bright Futures requirements have been revised for 2023-2024. The SAT score requirement for the Florida Academic Scholarship went up from 1330 to 1340. In addition, the Classic Learning Test has been added as an exam option for each scholarship. This test is offered online. Go to the <u>CLT website</u> to learn more or to register for the exam. Please refer to the <u>Bright Futures Handbook</u>, or the Guidance Services page on <u>Canvas</u> for additional information.

Grade Point Average (GPA) Transition Beginning with Current 9th Graders

Hillsborough County Public Schools is implementing a revised GPA weighting scale/calculation model that is recognized universally by colleges and universities. This will better prepare students for gaining admission to the post-secondary school of their choice. Current 9th grade students, with previously earned high school coursework, have been converted to the new weighting scale/calculation model. Applying to College

It is that time of year and students have begun applying for college.

Students should be:

- making a list of the schools they intend to submit applications to
- know how to apply
- know the PRIORITY deadlines
- know what supplemental information is required

Every college/university has their own admission application but may accept the <u>Common Application</u> or <u>Coalition</u> <u>Application</u> instead. No one application is better than another. Schools that have application options do so just to give students a choice.

November 1st is the priority deadline for most schools. Students are encouraged to apply by this date to have the highest consideration for admissions. Students who apply after priority deadlines dramatically reduce their chances for admission.

Many schools now require the SSAR (Student Self-Reported Academic Record). The SSAR is used in place of transcripts. If a school requires the SSAR, your application is not considered complete until the school receives this information.

Seniors need to send all SAT and ACT scores directly to the schools to which they are applying. To do this, your student will log into their College Board and ACT accounts and request the scores be sent. Steinbrenner High School cannot send test scores.

October 1 – The **Florida Financial Aid Application** (FFAA) for Bright Futures and all other state aid opens. Every senior should apply.
